**SUPPLEMENTARY STATEMENTS OF VARIOUS MEMBERS OF COUNCIL MEETING
AT MANDORE HALL, HOTEL SHREE RAM INTERNATIONAL, NEAR PANCHBATTI
CIRCULE, RESIDENCY ROAD, JODHPUR ON 18 NOVEMBER 2024.**

Shri Lakhbir Singh

Those members who left the meeting made our Association a Private Limited Company. I want to share the fact that this Group of 5 to 7 members who left the house have always tried to dominate the Association. At present all the disputes in the Association are facilitated by them. They did the same when the Team of Shri Bharat Bhasin with Shri Jaspal Mago as Hony. General Secretary and myself as Sr. Vice President were elected as HQ office Bearers by defeating their candidates, they started creating troubles. The group filed many through court cases in various courts situated at Jammu, Delhi. Before the start of Council meeting at Agra, they served stay for the meeting and in the complete tenure they made all possible efforts to stall the proceedings with court cases on the elected HQ team to prevent it to carry on with works

After that when at this team of 2023-2025 was elected which was not their choice was not digested by them. After that they created a conspiracy with Chairman DRRC and scrapped the whole election of HQ office Bearers even though DRRC Chairman had no power and authority to do so filled court case against the Association in various courts. They approached E-in-Cs branch asking it notto recognize the present Association. I want to share to the house about a notice served today to the Association which President has not brought to the knowledge of House. A group of three or four people always tried to dominate the Association by their money power and when not successful they walk out from the House. These persons may be wealthy but they should not dominate the Association and take advantages of soft and humble nature of our President. This proves from today's episode as well as of 31st July AGM when their followers left the house on one signal of their such masters. This group has made this Association as their private property for their personal advantages & do not want that any other member should come forward. You shall all appreciate that now in this term more than 200 members strength is seen in almost all council meetings whereas in their tenure the same was not more than 50. The increased participation of members is due to the fact that voice of common man voice is heard by the present dais.

They had made the life of our President and of the elected office bearers miserable. They telephonically threatened our President to act against Association norms. At the Jaipur meeting when Shri Bharat Bhasin was President they left the meeting in the same manner as it happen today on the directions of a single so called leader. Furthermore, the MES BAI Jodhpur branch which also comes under the Southern Command, should rightly belong to the Southern (N) Region. However it has been transferred to the South (West) Region without the approval of Council.


