**Item 2 of Agenda** : Confirmation of minutes of last AGM

**Sh. Prasanta Mahanta** Minutes of last AGM held on 31<sup>st</sup> July held at Habitat Center, New Delhi are to be confirmed. Minutes of the meeting have been circulated by Circular No.10 dated 03.09.2024 through E-mail which I hope all members would have received. The minutes were also uploaded on the website of the Association. If House approves, the minutes of last AGM be treated as read and confirmed.

After detailed discussions minutes of last AGM were confirmed and approved by the House unanimously.

**Item 3 of Agenda** Discussion and finalization of Group Insurance Scheme for Builder Members.

**Sh. G.S. Mago** If any one wishes to share their thoughts, they are welcome to do so. This morning, I clearly stated that beneficiaries are not required to pay a single penny for the insurance scheme as the entire premium amount will be borne by the Headquarters. I request Shri Ranbir Singh Punia to elaborate on the details of the Insurance Scheme for the benefit of the house.

**Sh. Rajeev Chowdhary** Sir I would like to seek clarification on an important aspect. If an individual wishes to enhance their insurance coverage by voluntarily contributing an additional amount, would there be an option to do so?

**Sh. Ranbir Singh Punia** This is a Group insurance Scheme, and any extension of coverage is not possible within its framework. However, if an individual wishes to enhance their coverage, they may opt for a separate individual insurance policy. Moreover, this scheme specifically covers only cases of death and accidental incidents.

**Sh. Rajesh Bahl** I have a suggestion that In annual premium a small amount should be paid by individual.

**Sh. G.S. Mago** Actually this insurance scheme has three categories. Table 1 covers death-related claims, Table2 provides coverage for permanent disability and Table 3 addresses temporary and total disability with benefits determined based on the individual's income. The annual premium amount fluctuates based on the claim coverage which needs to be collectively decided. Given that our headquarters is earning annual interest which is expected to increase over time, this additional premium will not impose a significant financial burden. Instead, it will enhance the welfare of our members. If any member can propose a better insurance scheme through their contacts, they are encouraged to share the details. At this stage, we are seeking approval on whether to proceed with the scheme or not.

After a detailed discussion, the insurance scheme has been unanimously confirmed and approved by the House.

**Sh. G.S. Mago** The Group Insurance Scheme with a coverage band between Rs 10 to Rs 20 lakhs has been officially approved by the house during the AGM. The annual premium amount will be fully borne by the headquarters. I sincerely thank you all for your support, blessings and approval. This initiative is the result of the collective vision and efforts of many of our esteemed members. While a similar scheme was proposed to 15 years ago, it

could not be implemented at that time. Now with your support we are optimistic that we can successfully execute this plan for the welfare of our members.

**Sh. R. M. Singhvi** On this joyous occasion of the 50<sup>th</sup> Annual Day celebration, we are privileged to receive a remarkable gift in the form of a Group Insurance Scheme, generously introduced by Sh G.S Mago. His thoughtful contribution is truly commendable and I sincerely appeal to this esteemed gathering to rise and give him a well deserved standing ovation in appreciation of his generosity and vision.

**Sh. G.S. Mago** This achievement is a result of our collective efforts and contributions. When we look back 50 years, we see how far we have come. Though what I offer today may seem small in comparison I assure you that I will continue to support and expand it in the future. I sincerely appreciate your approval and am truly humbled by the standing ovation. However, I believe I am not deserving of such an honor. Thank you all for your unwavering support and encouragement.

**Item 4 of Agenda** : Discussion on MESBAI Service Trust

**Sh. Prasanta Mahanta** Discussion on MESBAI Service Trust

**Sh. G.S. Mago** . I request Shri Vinod Bahl to elaborate on the MESBAI Service Trust

**Sh. Vinod Bahl** Sir, I believe our Hony Treasurer, Shri Shiv Kumar Gupta is more well versed in the details of the trust. I have a key observation regarding the service trust. It was established by our HQ, the Council and the AGM, with clear rules stating that elections must be held every three years. While HQ extended the tenure by two additional years due to COVID-19 or other reasons, it has now been over eight years and elections have still not been conducted. As per the Societies Act, the current office bearers cease to hold legal authority beyond their tenure. In such cases, the Registrar of Societies representative is supposed to take over and conduct the elections. Moreover, no other business can be conducted in that meeting apart from the election process. Now they have announced elections for 5<sup>th</sup> Mar 2025 but on what legal grounds?. They no longer hold a legitimate position to call for elections. While I fully support the trust's purpose and the benefits it provides to members, adherence to the rules outlined in the Memorandum of Association (MOA) is crucial. Every member possesses a copy of the MOA and it is clear that the tenure should have been three years with an additional two years extension was granted due to COVID-19. However, conducting elections after more that seven years in office is a violation of the established rules. The trust was formed through extensive discussions in the AGM and Council meetings. Given the current situation, I believe we should revoke the existing authority over the trust and allow HQ to take charge. Once that is done, HQ can conduct fair and transparent elections for the Service Trust, ensuring compliance with legal provisions.

**Sh. V. P. Sanjeev** During my tenure as CEC, there were two branches that failed to conduct elections despite being given sufficient and extended time. In such cases the HQ had to intervene and take over the process. A similar approach should be applied here. The current team has been unable to conduct elections for the past seven years, which clearly indicates their inefficiency. Since the Service Trust is an integral part of our Association, it is imperative that you take charge and ensure the proper conduct of elections.

**Sh. Karan Kapoor** I agree that elections were not finalized in the last meeting of the Service Trust. However, during that meeting, I suggested conducting the elections on 20<sup>th</sup> Feb 2025. You had mentioned that they could be held after 10-12 days. If the election date has already been decided, there should be no issue in discussing it further in the upcoming

meeting. It is essential that the Service Trust transitions to a new team following the elections scheduled for 3<sup>rd</sup> Mar 2025.

**Sh. Vinod Bahl** As the body himself is default then how their decision can be approved.

**Sh. Lalit Goel** The elections are about to take place and if they are conducted through the headquarters, the results will be fair and transparent. The current body has remained in position for the past six years which raises concerns about potential irregularities. Moreover, there has been a lack of communication as even we are unaware of the activities of the Service Trust. No official letters or updates have been circulated. I request you to take immediate control of the Service Trust and oversee the election process. At length please advise on the procedure for inducting new members into the Service Trust.

**Sh. Piyush Mishra** The primary objective of establishing the Service Trust was to support the needy members of our Association with complete transparency. However, it has been inactive for the past seven years. We must ask:-

- \* what has the Service Trust accomplished so far?.
- \* What is its current status?.
- \* What actions should be taken to make it more effective?.
- \* How can we increase membership and deposits to provide better assistance to those in need?

Unfortunately the Service Trust has lost its direction. We cannot rely solely on the old committees to drive change. It is essential to hand over its management to the Headquarters, ensuring accountability and transparency in all operations.

**Sh. Naveen Yadav** Our primary focus must be on reviving the Service Trust. However, internal groupism continues to hinder progress. If we take over without proper consensus, it may lead to further conflicts. As elections approaching, it is crucial to conduct them at the earliest to ensure a fair and transparent leadership transition. Unity must be our priority differences should not divide us. Instead, we must take concrete steps to strengthen brotherhood and cooperation among all members. A well functioning Service Trust will fulfill its purpose effectively and efficiently, benefiting those who truly need support.

**Sh. Vinod Bahl** I would like to present the legal provision before you. As per the rule, if an election is set aside by an order under Sub Section 1, or if an office bearer is deemed no longer entitled to continue in office, or if the Registrar of Societies is satisfied that the election of office bearers has not been conducted within the timeframe specified in the society's rule, the Registrar has the authority to convene a General Body meeting for electing new office bearers. Furthermore, such a meeting shall be presided over and conducted by the Registrar or his appointed representative, ensuring a fair and transparent election process.

**Sh. Shiv Kumar Gupta** Here is the feeling is that it gives the impression that nothing good is happening inside the Service Trust. So first I want to tell you that we have FDs worth 52.00 lakhs rupees and we can spend only the interest of that FDs. During this financial year, we helped two members, one from Jammu and one from Sagar in Branch and Sh. Piyush Mishra raised question on transparency . I want to clarify that name of beneficiary members was approved by council . Also, third one is also approved and sent to us by you. I

too had resigned from that three years ago and wanted fresh elections . Now the date of election has been fixed for 5th March. So I don't think there is a need to go beyond this. As the rule is read by my brother Vinod Bahl ji According to the rule, Registrar should conduct the election. So should we go in that direction. I think we should not , we are discussing about elections and they have already said that elections will be held on 5th. One more point raised by members about is 'takeover'. I was against the word 'Takeover' . MESBAI cannot takeover the Service Trust. Some gentleman were also among us in service trust meeting and said that those who had made a voluntary offer to pay in Service Trust that money should be bear by MESBAI. So I told them that if MESBAI if we hand over liability of service trust to MESBAI of depositing money in the form of donation, then MESBAI will be able to take over the Service Trust. Both are separate entities, decision will be taken on 5th march , which team will be elected. If you want to make trustees, then lets create trustees . When i joined the Service Trust then I had great hopes, and I thought that I had promised that one day I will make the service trust so big that member will proud in saying that they are in MESBAI and Service Trust but of course that work could not be done. we have to know that why we are not able to do so. Today there are many debates going on about why there is two or four thousand fees, they keep saying every time that we should decrease the fees. When there is a fight over a fee of Rs 2,000/- so where will the money come from in the service trust? A member in Sagar was in trouble, so at that time we appealed to the Service Trust and collected Rs. 2,18,000/- and gave it to him. So Service Trust is yours and you have to take initiative, it will not come forward just by the words of this meeting. So it is my humblest submission that elections are conducted on 5th March and elect the person according to your choice.

**Sh. G.S. Mago** Sh Shiv kumar Gupta has already provided a detailed explanation regarding the Service Trust. With elections scheduled for 05<sup>th</sup> Mar 2025, I sincerely appreciate the efforts being made in this regard. It is crucial for everyone present here to clearly understand the legal framework governing the flow of funds. According to the law, we should utilize only the interest earned on fixed deposits (FDs) for expenses. However, due to the absence of timely elections, the Trust has been paying taxes as per the Companies Act. The lack of initiative has resulted in an unnecessary tax payment of approximately Rs 2.00 Lakh which should have been avoided. To rectify this, we must immediately appoint new trustees and conduct elections. Further, holding elections on private property is inappropriate and must be avoided. Since this is a Trust function and not a privat3e gathering, the Trust itself is fully capable of covering the expenses. If the AGM approves, we should allow a 30-45 days period to add new members. After that, a proper venue not a private property must be selected to ensure transparency and fairness in the process.

**Sh. Shiv Kumar Gupta** For donation We have a category like Rs 11001/- to Rs 21000/-. If you give a donation within the service trust, then the donors will elect trustees of the service trust as per our category . It is like we elect council. There are different types of categories : Category A 11001 to 21000/- , B -21001to 51,000, C- 51001 to 1,00,000/-, D- 1,00,001 to 2,00,000/- E -2,00,001 to 3,00,000 and category F above 3,00,000/- Two trustees will be elected from Ato D category and three from E and F category . It is obvious that many peoples are there in category A very few in category F as per my records. So, this is a completely different structure.

**Sh. G.S. Mago** Since the proposal has been accepted by the AGM, we will address any obstacles and make amendments if necessary. Under normal circumstances the election process would have proceeded as planned if conducted within the allotted time. However,

given the current situation, the election will now be conducted by the Election Commission rather than the Secretary.

**Sh. Shiv Kumar Gupta** I would like to mention that branches also have trustee branches. Any branch can now become a trustee by making a donation to a specific category.

**Sh. G.S. Mago** Since both the Chairman and the Secretary of branches are members of the Service Trust. Trust office bearer should proceed in accordance with what the House approves and as per MOA. If challenges arise, the established process must be followed. As outlined in our MOA, elections cannot be conducted after a specified period, at which point a predefined mechanism must be activated.

**Sh. Gagan Sood** As we discuss the Service Trust, I believe that a significant number of our members estimated between 75 to 80 percent lack of clear understanding of its MOA. Many are not even aware of who qualifies as a member or how to join. In view of this, I humbly request that the Articles of Association be distributed to everyone. This will ensure that all members have the necessary information and can participate fully in the Trust's activities.

**Sh. G.S. Mago** In order to increase membership, the information will be posted on the website and shared with all Chairmen and Secretaries. With this, we conclude that all points have been accepted, the motion is approved and there are no objections.


